

The State of New Mexico, through its Oil Conservation Commission, hereby gives notice that the Commission will conduct a public hearing at 9:00 A.M. on May 15, 2003 in Porter Hall, 1220 South St. Francis Drive, Santa Fe, New Mexico concerning the adoption of a new section of 19.15.1 NMAC relating to compulsory pooling of properties for oil and gas exploration. The proposed new rule will provide that the charge for risk to be included in compulsory pooling orders of the division, unless specific evidence in a particular case war-

rants a different amount, will be 200% of well costs for wells to be drilled as wildcats or to established pools other than the Basin-Fruitland Coal. 156% of well costs for wells to be drilled to the Basin-Fruitland Coal Gas Pool, and 100% for wells already drilled. The proposed new section will be codified as 19.15.1.35 NMAC. NEW MEXICO ENERGY, MINERALS AND NATURAL RESOURCES DEPARTMENT

OIL CONSERVATION DIVISION

Explanatory Paragraph: This is an amendment to 19.15.9.711 NMAC, Section 711. The amendment to Section 711 permits, with prior approval of the Division, other non-hazardous, non-oil-field waste to be accepted into a permitted surface waste management facility if the waste is similar in physical and chemical composition to the oilfield wastes authorized for disposal at that facility and is either exempt from the "hazardous waste" provisions of Subtitle C of the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act or has tested non-hazardous and is not listed as hazardous.

19.15.9.711 APPLICABLE TO SURFACE WASTE MANAGEMENT FACILITIES ONLY

C. Operational Requirements

(4) The permittee shall require the following documentation for accepting wastes, other than wastes returned from the wellbore in the normal course of well operations such as produced water and spent treating fluids, at commercial waste management facilities:

(c) Non-oilfield Wastes: Nonhazardous, [N]non-oilfield wastes may be accepted in an emergency if ordered by the Department of Public Safety. Prior to acceptance, a "Request To Accept Solid Waste", OCD Form C-138 accompanied by the Department of Public Safety order will be submitted to the appropriate District office and the Division's Santa Fe office. With prior approval from the Division, other non-hazardous, non-oilfield waste may be accepted into a permitted surface waste management facility if the waste is similar in physical and chemical composition to the oilfield wastes authorized for disposal at that facility and is either: (1) exempt from the "hazardous waste" provisions of Subtitle C of the federal Resource Conservation and Recovery Act; or (2) has tested non-hazardous and is not listed as hazardous. Prior to acceptance, a "Request For Approval to Accept Solid Waste," OCD Form C-138, accompanied by acceptable documentation to characterize the waste, shall be submitted to and approved by the Division's Santa Fe office.

The current version of the "FMB Financial Management Guide for Welfare to Work" has been replaced, effective April 15, 2003, to create a record to match the 1999 Welfare to Work Amendments for compliance with federal findings. Revisions include the incorporation of the '1999 Welfare to Work Amendments'; eligibility determination guidance for formula grants; revised instructions for reporting Welfare to Work formula and competitive grants financial data; revised Cumulative Quarterly Formula Grant Financial Reports reflecting the June 2000 data report restructuring by USDOL; and a number of minor revisions throughout the chapters and appendices. Pages iii and iv, the 'January through August 2002 Revisions', list the locations and types of all of the revisions.
