


purpose of the hearing is to consider the matter of EIB 14-03 (R), proposed repeal and replacement to the New Mexico State Implementation Plan ("SIP") regarding Air Quality Control Regulation Part 99 (Conformity to the State Implementation Plan of Transportation Plans, Programs, and Projects) New Mexico Administrative Code ("20.2.99 NMAC").

The proponent of this regulatory repeal and replacement is the New Mexico Environment Department ("NMED").

The purpose of the public hearing is to consider and take possible action on a petition from the NMED to repeal and replace 20.2.99 NMAC. The proposed repeal and replacement of 20.2.99 NMAC is in response to amendments issued by the Environmental Protection Agency January 24, 2008 and March 14, 2012 to 40 CFR Part 93, Subpart A - Conformity to State or Federal Implementation Plans of Transportation Plans, Programs, and Projects Developed, Funded or Approved under Title 23 U.S.C. or the Federal Transit Laws. 40 CFR 93 Subpart A was amended to allow states to streamline their regulations and eliminate the provisions unrelated to implementation by the State. Upon adoption by the Board, the repeal and replacement of 20.2.99 NMAC would be submitted to EPA for incorporation into New Mexico's SIP.

The proponent of this regulatory adoption and revision is the New Mexico Environment Department ("NMED").

The purpose of the public hearing is to consider and take possible action on a petition from NMED to revise 20.2.74 NMAC. The proposed revisions are in response to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's ("EPA") December 9, 2013, amendments to federal rules 40 CFR 51.166 and 52.21. The amendments by the EPA to the federal rules address the January 22, 2013, United States Court of Appeals for the District of Columbia Circuit vacatur and remand of two prevention of significant deterioration provisions that were promulgated by EPA in 2010. The two provisions include the Significant Impact Levels (SILs) and Significant Monitoring Concentrations (SMC) for particulate matter 2.5 microns in size and less (PM_{2.5}). The Court's vacatur of the PM, SILs and the SMC means that these provisions can no longer be relied upon by either permit applicants or permitting authorities. The NMED is proposing to remove the PM_{a.s.} SILs provision and revise the PM₂ SMC provision that were incorporated into 20.2.74 NMAC in May 2011. If adopted by the Board, the revisions to 20.2.74 NMAC would be submitted to EPA for incorporation into New Mexico's SIP.

The New Mexico Environmental Improvement Board (Board) will hold a public hearing beginning at 9:00 a.m. on Friday, July 11, 2014, and continuing thereafter as necessary at the New Mexico State Capitol Building, Room 307, 490 Old Santa Fe Trail, Santa Fe, New Mexico. The hearing location may change prior to the hearing date, and those interested in attending should check the EIB website: http://www.nmenv.state.nm.us/eib/ prior to the hearing. The purpose of the hearing is to consider proposed amendments to Liquid Waste Disposal and Treatment Rules, 20.7.3 NMAC (Rules). The New Mexico Environment Department (NMED) is the proponent of the amendments to the Rules.

The amendments proposed by NMED to 20.7.3 NMAC would increase the scope of the regulations from the current 2,000 gallons per day or less of liquid waste received by an on-site system, to 5,000 gallons per day or less, such that permits for

certain larger on-site liquid waste systems that are currently regulated by NMED's Ground Water Quality Bureau would be transferred to the Department's Liquid Waste Program.

In addition, the proposed amendments include several other minor changes and clarifications to current definitions, regulations, and procedures. Please note that formatting and minor technical changes in the regulations other than those proposed by petitioners may be proposed at the hearing. In addition, the Board may make other changes as necessary to accomplish the purpose of providing public health and safety in response to public comments and evidence presented at the hearing.

- (2) Method of calculation. The director shall take into account the number of participants in each approved program, the total amount collected (minus the administrative fee) divided by the total amount of approved participants for that fiscal year and disburse to each participating sponsor.

A monthly record of contributions shall be submitted to the public works unit of the labor relations division, New Mexico department of workforce solutions, identifying the project by state wage decision number, week ending, employee's name, number of hours, and rate in the following format by **all** contractors/subcontractors employing laborers or mechanics requiring apprenticeship contributions in the following sample form.

- C. A monthly check of contributions and the above compliance statement shall be submitted by contractors that **do not** participate in an approved apprenticeship and training program to the apprenticeship and training fund, labor relations division, New Mexico department of workforce solutions.
 - D. A notation shall be made in each certified payroll indicating where payment is being sent when applicable.
- E. The director shall publish a list of approved apprenticeship and training programs in New Mexico to be furnished upon request.
