

STATE GAME COMMISSION MEETING AND RULE MAKING NOTICE

The New Mexico State Game Commission (“Commission”) will be hosting a virtual meeting and rule hearing on Thursday, December 3, 2020 beginning at 9:00 a.m. The State Game Commission postponed the hearing, previously scheduled for October 16, 2020. The purpose of this meeting is to hear and consider action as appropriate on the following: presentation of proposed changes to the Hunter Education rule.

Synopsis:

The proposal is to amend the Hunter Education rule, 19.36.3 NMAC, which will become effective January 1, 2021.

The proposed new rule will include changes to reduce the minimum age to participate in the Mentored-Youth Hunting Program from 10 to 8 years of age, add pronghorn antelope to allowable species Mentored-Youth may hunt, add mentor training requirement and make minor spelling corrections.

Interested persons may also provide data, views or arguments, orally or in writing, at the virtual public rule hearing to be held on December 3, 2020.
