1. Subject to the terms and conditions hereinafter set forth, I <u>Diane Shirley Kinderwater</u> (hereinafter referred to as the Donor), hereby give, donate, and convey to the New Mexico Commission of Public Records (hereinafter referred to as the Donee), as an unrestricted gift for deposit in the State Archives of New Mexico,

Diane Shirley Kinderwater- Capturing Life Around the Dial; Capitol; Americas; & Millennium. (Eight cubic feet)

The Collection is historical and unique. The Collection travels through time and across the Americas.

The Collection is historical, unique and across the Americas-

The Collection owner was shot at in war-torn El Salvador during its civil war; shot and hit in Guatemala, witnessed up close and personal the first New Mexico Governor to be elected to two, four-year terms, too up close to the Cerro Grande fire burning near buried plutonium surrounding the Los Alamos National Labs. The owner interviewed and met many celebrities, notables and the notorious during her career. (History can decide who is what!) People such as: Arnold Schwarzenegger, President Jimmy Carter, the number one tennis player in the world Novak Djokovic, actor Ted Danson, Kenny Rogers during Hands Across America at the New Mexico/Texas border, Shirley MacLaine and many more famous folks. The Collection owner produced the first Official Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta video, produced the first Hispanic Health Fair in New Mexico, was the Master of Ceremonies and helped produce the First Mariachi Fiesta in New Mexico. The Collection owner's historic, original photo of a "first!" The first time five New Mexico's governors are photographed together. The Collection owner is recognized with life-time achievement certificates and awards from the New Mexico State Senate and KCHF TV 11. The Collection owner represented New Mexico in the National Senior Olympics and National Seniors Games; and at the State Games of America. The owner won Gold and Bronze medals. The owner is named in various issues of Who's Who in America.

The owner was the first person to be struck by a bowling ball while producing a bowling video in New Mexico. (Signed bowling ball to be included! Injured knee won't be included in the Collection.)

The Collection travels through time.

It showcases how New Mexicans and the people we elect into public office acted, spoke and thought during the end of the last Millennium and the beginning of the current Millennium. It embodies what was important to us in the 1970s, 1980s, 1990s, 2000-2023. It features some of the major, historical events and topics of the past 40 years and also focuses on everyday life during our times. The Collection does this via: In-depth television interviews; video interviews; video news conferences; news reports; news releases; newspaper articles; newspaper photos; promotional materials and more.

There are seven main parts of the Collection:

- 1. Celebrities, notables and the notorious-
- 2. Diane Kinderwater's interviews of New Mexicans spanning over 25 years as producer and host of the New Mexico public affairs television program at KCHF TV 11.
- 3. Kinderwater's work as the Director of Communications for Governor Gary E. Johnson for eight years, during the change of the Millennium, and on his campaign.
- 4. Kinderwater's work as the Director of Communications for the Senate Minority Leadership Office for over 18 years.
- 5. Kinderwater's work at additional New Mexico TV stations- KOB TV 4, KOAT TV 7, KLUZ TV 41 and stations in El Salvador; Guatemala, Texas, Minnesota and Wisconsin.
- 6. Kinderwater's production of the first "Official Albuquerque International Balloon Fiesta Video;" additional balloon videos; photos, and AIBF balloon memorabilia.
- 7. Diane Kinderwater- the person, businesswoman, teacher, athlete and her family legacy in media.

When the Collection is complete, highlights are expected to include:

- "Around the turn of the Millennium" TV interviews featuring: CBS 60 Minutes Correspondent- the Late Ed Bradley; CBS news staff, Governor Gary E. Johnson, Cabinet members, New Mexicans.
- TV interviews, scripts, DVDs, video tapes the media professional produced "Around the Dial" at TV channels- KCHF TV 11; KOB TV 4; KOAT TV 7; KLUZ TV 41, KDBC TV 4; KAAL TV 6; KXLN TV 45; WHA- TV and at radio stations, too. These varied

stations include work- In Spanish TV, Christian TV, Public TV, ABC, NBC, CBS affiliates.

- "Around the Americas" work and life in El Salvador, Guatemala, United States of America- New Mexico, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Texas.
- TV interviews, news releases "Around the New Mexico State Capitol" from the 4th floor of the Governor's Office, down to the 1st Floor of the Senate Minority Office and even floors and positions in between.
- The Collection to include original September 11th attack media- A NEW DAY OF INFAMY screaming from the front page of the Albuquerque Journal; Time Magazine- One Nation, Indivisible Special Issue. Also, Time Magazine-The Roswell Files. GLODE-DI IN NEW SEX SCANDAL published after her tragic death. Election 2000 Sanchez Race Still A Tossup; Court Finds Governor In Contempt; 2000- From Santa Fe to Sydney- Y2K Bug's bite.

- 2. Title to the Materials shall pass to the Donee upon their delivery to the Donee.
- 3. The Donor hereby gives and assigns to the Donee all rights of copyright which the donor has in the Materials and in such of his works as may be found among any collections of Materials received by the Donee from others.
- 4. The Donor hereby declares that the Donor has the full legal authority to transfer all rights, title and ownership of the Materials. The Donor hereby transfers such custody and ownership willingly, completely, and without reservation. The Donee assumes that the Materials are offered in good faith and that the Donor has full legal authority to convey and transfer all gifts free and clear of all claims by others.
- 5. It is the Donor's wish that the Materials be made available for research. The Donor recognizes that the Materials may include some information, which, at present, should not be released. Accordingly, the Donee shall have the Materials reviewed and for the present shall restrict access to the following Materials.

- 6. Materials which have been restricted from access as herein provided shall be reviewed by the Donee from time to time and any Materials which, because of the passage of time, or other circumstances, no longer require such restrictions shall be opened to public access.
- 7. Subject to the restrictions imposed herein, the Donee may dispose of any of the Materials, which the Donee determines are not required by the New Mexico Commission of Public Records State Archives of New Mexico.
- 8. In the event the Donor may from time to time hereafter give, donate and convey to the Donee, for deposit in the State Archives of New Mexico, additional papers and other historical Materials, title to such additional papers and other historical Materials shall pass to the Donee upon their delivery, and all of the provisions of this instrument of gift shall be applicable to such additional papers and other historical Materials. A description of the additional papers and/or other historical Materials so donated and delivered shall be prepared and attached hereto.
